Archaeology and the Bible

The Hebrew Bible (The Old Testament)

It's the foundation stone upon which is built the moral and ethical aspirations of the more than 3.8 billion Jews, Christians and Muslims living in the world today. And yet it's the product of a poor and tiny nation that existed in the shadow lands between the ancient world's most powerful civilizations.

But who were the Israelites and where did they come from?

Were the Patriarchs real people and if so, when did they live?

Was the Exodus a historical event?

Was there a United Kingdom under King David?

What events led to the destruction of the first Temple, and how did that impact the writing of the Bible?

These are profound questions that go to the heart of Western civilization. What does archaeology have to say about them? The course takes a look at the historical basis of the Biblical narrative, drawing on the findings of archaeological science with particular emphasis on the ground-breaking insights of the past 20 years. The focus is not on *proving* the Bible, but rather on *understanding* it.

Footprints of Abraham, Sands of Time. Where can we place the Patriarchs in time and space?

Strangers in a Strange Land. The search for the historical Exodus.

Conquest and Judges. Who were the ancient Israelites and where did they come from?

King David and Early Judah. What secrets lay buried at Khirbet Qeiyafah near where David fought Goliath?

The Destruction of Judah, the Birth of the Bible. The last 120 years of the kingdom of Judah and the worldchanging impact of the Babylonian Exile. (2 sessions)
